	The Cantonese program has developed beginning and intermediate Cantonese conversation courses from beginner to intermediate level a year ago. However, these courses offerings were suspended due to the statewide budget crisis for post-secondary schools. There are great demands from the students who complete CANT 3 and would like to continue studying in the conversation courses. These would be the courses they need the most. Cantonese courses offer during the night time and they attract students and community learners at the same time.
