I shall cover chapters 4,5 , partially chapter 6 and 10.7 section of the book. We are going to learn basic concepts of trigonometry, graphs of trigonometric functions and their inverse functions. Then topics of analytic trigonometry. Chapter 6 is related Law of Sines, Law of Cosines, and trigonometric form of complex numbers. We are going to use TI-83 plus graphing calculator intensively.

WebAssign course name and class key are written above. You need class key when you create your account. Late homework will not be accepted for grading purpose.
